CONTENT: This is an advanced Algebra course. It is intended that the entire content of

our textbook will have been covered by the end of the year. Passing Algebra 2 is not a graduation requirement, but a grade of C or higher is needed to fulfill the a-g requirement for UC/CSU. The goal of this class is for everyone to meet those requirements and to be prepared to take further mathematics

courses here or elsewhere, all while having fun!

EXTRA HELP: In order to finish the book, we will be moving fast, usually a section a day. To

help you keep up, I will be available every day during our class time. You may stay after I excuse the class or log back on anytime during the period. I will be more than happy to help if you have questions or need help with the curriculum or with any of the technology or websites that we are using. You

can also email me if you need help outside of class.

ASSIGNMENTS: During distance learning, most homework will be done in Delta Math: deltamath.com. Use your @jsusd.org email address to create your account (if

you don't already have an account) and enter my teacher code -- 535892. Then

select your class period.

REQUIREMENTS:

1. Log in to our Google Classroom every school day at the beginning of the class period and check into the LIVE Meet Link. If you are unable to join

the meet, you must answer the attendance question for the day. If you do not check in during class you must "Private Comment" me telling me why you

missed class, otherwise you will be marked absent.

2. Attend Google Meet sessions on the required days and times, these are in our Google Classroom Banner for each class, and complete any tasks given during those sessions. The LIVE Meets count as a warm-up. The link is

located on our Google Classroom Banner.

3. Complete daily assignments in Google Classroom and/or Delta Math, and make sure to come back to the Classwork and "Mark as Done". Assignments are graded on correctness and 10% will be deducted for 1 day late, and 25% for 2 days late through the end of the chapter, at that point the

assignment will be 50% of the earned credit.

4. Check your school email account (@jsusd.org) at least once per school day.

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Students are expected to actively participate in class everyday by logging in to Google Classroom and Meet sessions on time; by taking notes as needed during Meet sessions or asynchronous presentations; and by asking/answering questions, giving explanations, and completing tasks in Meet sessions or asynchronous presentations. In addition to being a percentage of a student's final grade, homework is the best way for students to master the concepts covered in class and prepare for upcoming quizzes and tests. Semester grades are calculated using the following percentages: Homework = 20%, Classwork & Quizzes = 15%, Tests = 50%, Semester Exam = 15%.
