School Goals

1. All students will make one year's growth in reading level as measured by Running Records, Star Reading from Accelerated Reader, MAP growth assessments, and ESGI data.
2. All students will learn math facts appropriate for their grade level as measured by Xtra Math Practice or math fact practice to apply to grade level math problems.
3. All students will set personal WIGS (Wildly Important Goals) in reading and math and monitor progress on goals.
4. We will increase our community engagement opportunities and build relationships with families by hosting events and communicating regularly.
5. Increase the percentage of students that attend school each day to 93%.
6. Students will increase self-awareness of their emotions, recognizing peers or even characters in stories exhibiting similar emotions and learn emotion management techniques using mindfulness, strategies from Leader in Me, and restorative practices.
